Mentorship Programme

One of the goals of the Alumni is a sustained relationship between current students at Aabuthnott Gallimore High and the Alumni. To accomplish this goal, we have begun a mentoring program at the school where past students with the approval of the school's administration, have visited the school and have given pep talks to at risk students who are playing truants - encouraging them to stay in school.

We want to develop an emotional bond with these students. We can only do so by providing support, guidance, and opportunities in whatever capacity we can.

The Alumni planned on having pep workshops to help students transition into college and or universities. We will guide and help students choose courses to suit their preferred choice of career path. We will further assist students with CAPE and SAT preparations, including the writing of scholarship essays. We also want to build their self-esteem, thus giving them an optimal attitude about school as they work towards their goals and aspirations. By having a vibrant mentoring program for the general student body, we hope to see a lower or zero dropout rate among students.

Deriving from this mentorship program is that currently, there are past students who have committed to sponsoring a student who requires financial assistance to attend school.
